

## The Generations Scroll

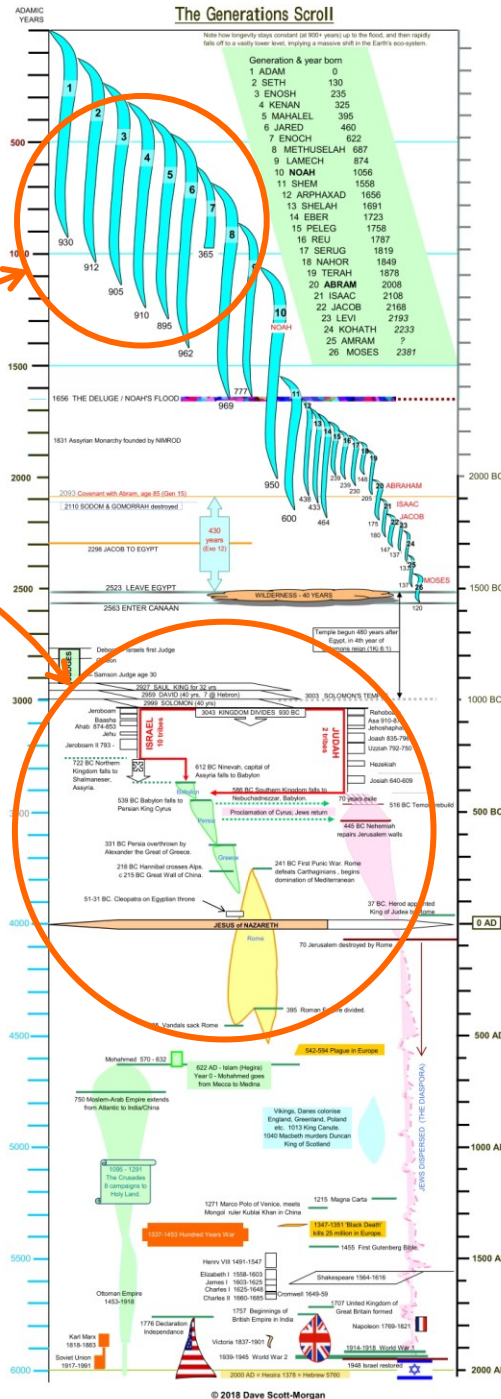
The Scroll depicts to scale the epochs of men and nations, from the earliest biblical record down to the present time.

At the top, blue 'teardrops' each represent the individual life-span of the ancients,

Further down, the rise and fall of empires and powers is charted - in particular the history of the Hebrew people, the Jews, who recorded events from ancient times.

Evolutionists claim that the earliest men appeared millions of years ago, having been derived from other living forms, but the Scroll takes data from the direction of the creator God. From this account it is obvious that the ancients had, what is to us now, fantastical life spans, and that the overwhelming event in antiquity was the world-wide Flood of Noah. The Scroll illustrates how this event resulted in a massive and irrevocable transformation of the ecosphere, as evidenced by the shortening of life spans afterwards. The chaos of the Flood lasted for 9 months and afterwards, the longevity of men (almost 1,000 years before the Flood) rapidly tailed off to an upper limit of 120 years.

The Scroll can be hung on a wall using poster hangers (available separately). These have a wooden finish and are attached magnetically to the top and bottom of the scroll.



In every way, the Flood of Noah represents an 'event horizon' that conventional science does not acknowledge and cannot adequately peer behind. The Flood, and the biblical record preceding it, has no common ground with conventional 'evolutionary' time-spans.

But the fact is that modern day Evolutionary theory is just that - a theory, which itself is an extrapolation of the known mechanism of natural selection within a species. The supposition is that over millions of years, a change of species 'could' have happened, but the spontaneous creation of more complex DNA coding necessary for the journey from microbe to man has actually never been observed.

The truth is there is no known agency which could account for one species developing into another, more complex one. Evolution then, is as much a faith based belief system as belief in the creator and the biblical record.

Dating conventions used are taken from the Torah and the work of scholars such as Ussher. Adamic (Torah) dates hold good until the time of Moses, and thereafter dates are reckoned in years BC.
